



## LA CROSSE COUNTY CAMPSITE POLICY



1. All campers are expected to abide by park and health code rules/regulations/policies and strive to maintain a high standard of conduct. (ref. La Crosse County Code of Ordinance; copy available in the campground store.)
2. Monthly camping permit holders are expected to abide by the same conditions as seasonal camping permit holders.
3. All campers are expected to maintain their campsites in a neat and orderly manner. Your receipt must be displayed on the numbered site post.
4. Quiet time in the campground is 11 PM to 6 AM. All non-campers must be out of the campground during this time.
5. No additional structures (i.e. fences, flag poles) are to be erected outside of the camping unit without permission of the Facilities Department. Do not attach any items to trees. One screened tent (up to 14'x14') allowed per site. One county owned picnic table per site. One exterior storage locker allowed per site with a size limit of 10 sq. ft. All outdoor furniture shall be manufactured and intended for use as lawn furniture. Plastic tarpaulins are allowed as a woodpile or tent cover only. Carpet as ground cover is allowed with a campsite limit of 192 sq. ft. Portable garage tents, old couches, chairs, car seats, etc. are not acceptable. Refrigerators/freezers and umbrella clotheslines are not allowed. Portable generators are allowed in overflow campground ONLY. Must be turned off between 11 pm-6 am.
6. To facilitate grounds keeping, vegetable/flower/garden plots will not be allowed. Grass fertilization is not allowed.
7. Each site shall be allowed no more than two vehicles on a regular basis. All campers must park on their own site. Visitor parking is available in the front of the campground by the basketball court.
8. To minimize any restriction to shoreline access during the camping season, one watercraft is allowed secured to the shoreline in designated area only when in use. When not in use, it is requested that the watercraft be trailered. All watercrafts must be registered with the campground office. Note: Shoreline parking at waterfront sites is reserved with the campsite.
9. Firewood supply must be kept in a neat pile no larger than one "face cord" (4'x8'x24"). Pallets and other box type wooden structures are not allowed. To protect our parks and forest areas we follow the WI DNR rule regarding firewood. Firewood is available for purchase at the campground store. (Campers cannot purchase firewood from outside the campgrounds and have it delivered into the campground.)
10. Do not place or burn garbage in fireplaces. A trash bag is available at time of registration. Dumpsters for registered campers only. Bag all trash securely, place in dumpsters and close the dumpster after use. Prohibited items include flammables or toxic materials, furniture, appliances, tires, auto batteries, mattresses and carpets. **LA CROSSE COUNTY ENCOURAGES RECYCLING; CONTAINERS ARE LOCATED BY THE DUMPSTERS.** No rummaging or scavenging is allowed in dumpsters or recycling bins.
11. Fireworks that leave the ground or blow into pieces (for example and not inclusive: bottle rockets, firecrackers, roman candles) are not allowed. (Exception granted to campground manager upon receipt of required permits.)
12. Water hookups will be available from April 15th to October 15th. La Crosse County reserves the right to change the beginning or end date due to weather/flood conditions.
13. Dogs are allowed; however, they must be on a leash, kept under control which includes excessive barking and are not to be left unattended. Waste must be disposed of immediately and properly. All dogs must be current with vaccinations and tags. All dogs must be registered with the campground office upon arrival. If complaints are received by campground management, your pet displays aggressiveness or nuisance barking, or waste is not immediately removed, campground management may ban the dog from the campground.
14. Smoking is not allowed in any of the campground buildings.
15. During periods of extreme fire hazard, flooding or weather emergency, special precautions or measures may have to be ordered by La Crosse County. In such events, the campground may be closed or other precautionary measures ordered. All campers and guests shall immediately comply with orders to take special precautions or evacuated the campground.
16. All interpretations of these rules are within the authority of the Campground Manager.
